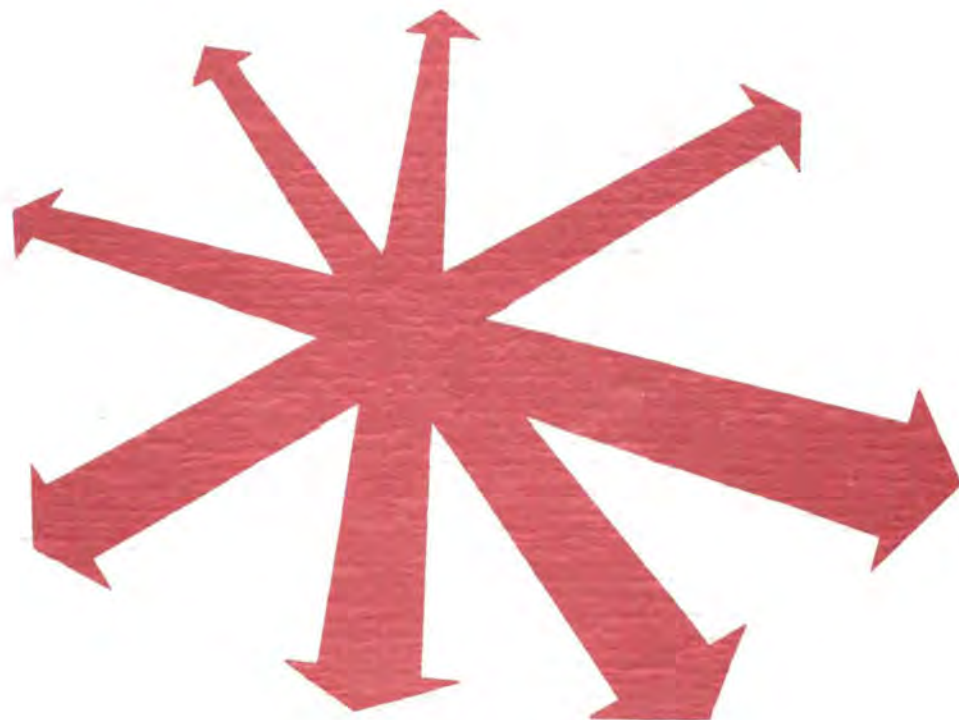

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P R E F A C E

These tables are a supplement to the Historical Statistics of Newfoundland and Labrador Volume I (1) which was prepared by the Economics and Statistics Division, Department of Finance, Government of Newfoundland and Labrador, in October of 1970.

As this supplement is intended merely to update the data presented in Volume I (1), no detailed notes, definitions, or concepts are included in the supplement, and data from Volume I (1) is included only where necessary to clarify the presentation of the supplemental data. However, some of the 227 tables were not updated because the relevant data was not available, but these instances have been noted in the following table.

This supplement, Volume I (4), contains all the data in the first supplement, Volume I (2) published in November, 1971, and in the second supplement, Volume I (3) published in November, 1972.

Copies of the Historical Statistics of Newfoundland and Labrador can be obtained from the Department of Public Works and Services, Government of Newfoundland and Labrador, St. John's, Newfoundland, upon payment of \$4.50 per copy. Newfoundland and Labrador residents should remit 7% sales tax.

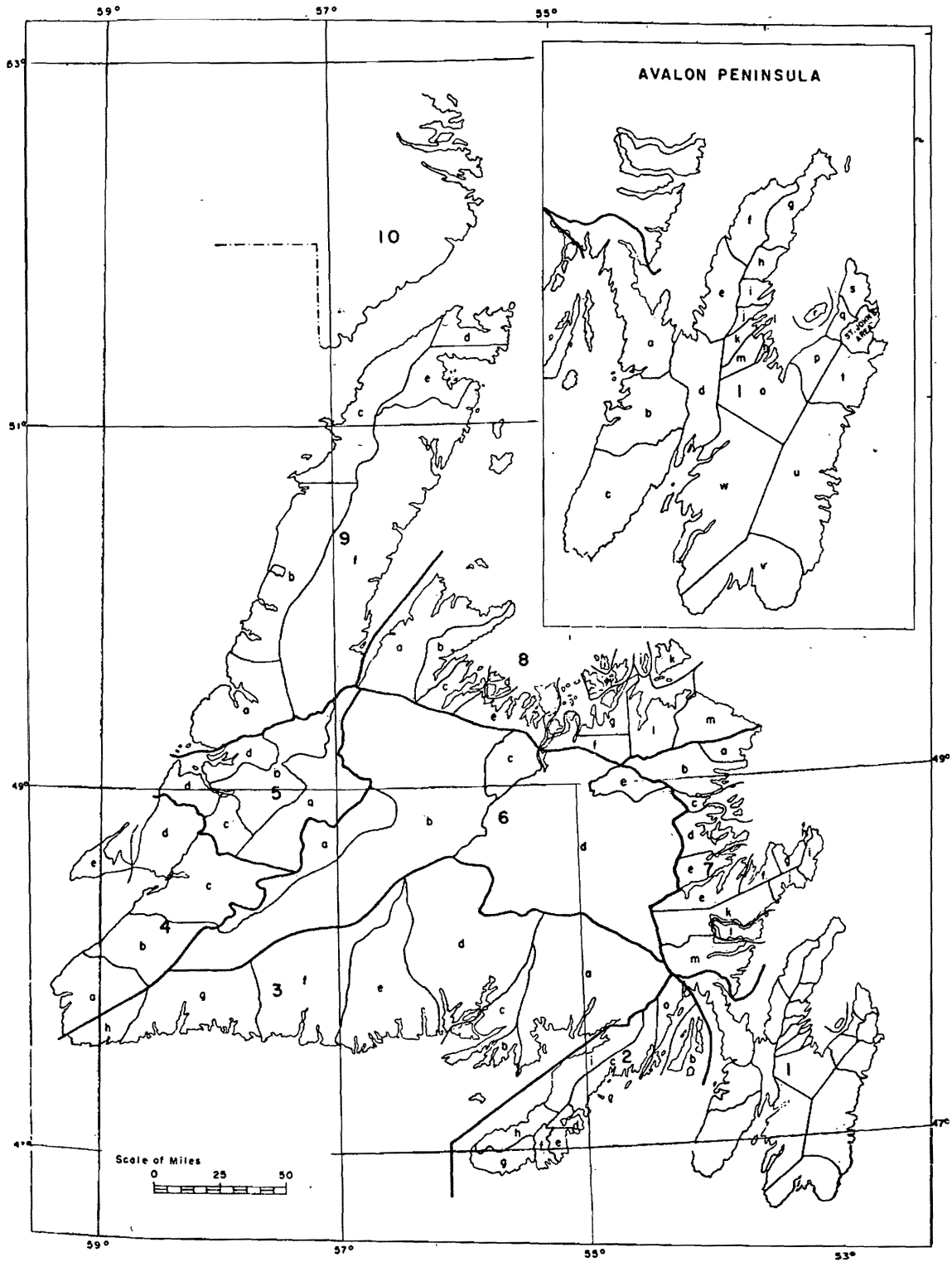

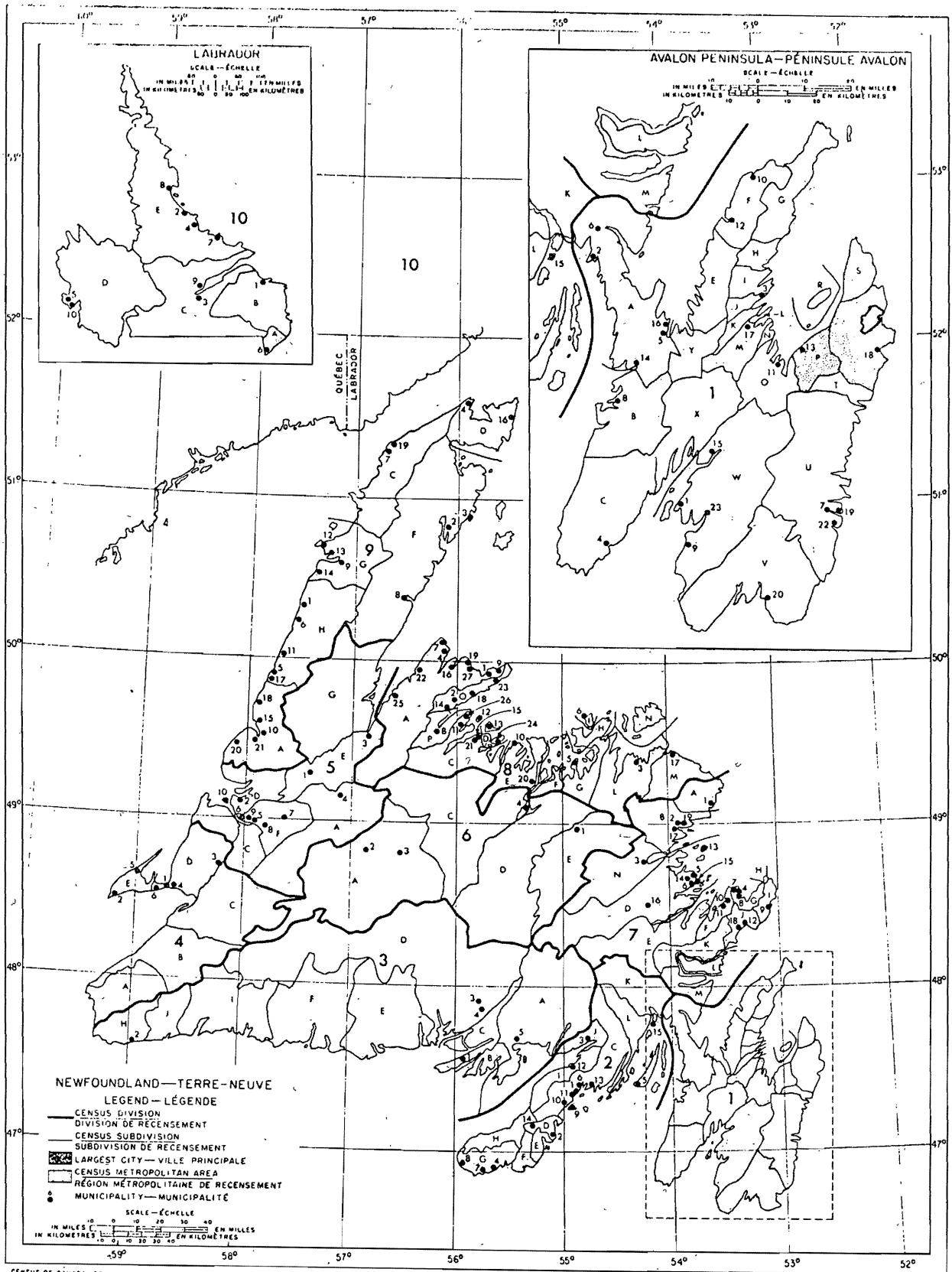

Part-time: Those engaged in fishing activity for less than 10 but more than 5 months of the year.

Casual: Those engaged for less than 5 months of the year.
