¹ The "Son or daughter" category indicates that almost half of the minimum wage workers in the Province are the son or daughter in a household versus living on their own.

Notes:

(1) Numbers may not sum to the total due to rounding.

(2) X represent estimates of less than 500, which are below the minimum criteria for release.

(3) Self-employed and unpaid family workers are excluded.

(4) The minimum wage was \$11.40 per hour from January 1 to March 31, 2020; \$11.65 from April 1 to September 30, 2020; \$12.15 from October 1 to December 31, 2020.

(5) Estimates produced with the Labour Force Survey (LFS) Public Use Microdata File (PUMF) may differ from the ones published by Statistics Canada as the weights are calculated differently for confidentiality reasons.
