Definitions and Explanations:**Regular Students:**

Students who meet the matriculation requirements of the University and who are registered in at least four courses in any semester are termed Regular Students. For purposes of the Residence Requirements, a student is deemed to have been in attendance for an academic year as a Regular Student if during each of two semesters he was registered in at least four courses and at the end of this time had completed at least three full-credit courses or equivalent.

First Year:

Students who have been registered from Junior Matriculation, or its equivalent, for the current academic year are classified as First-Year students.

Second Year:

Students who have earned not less than three credits at the beginning of the academic year are classified as Second-Year students.

Third Year:

Students who have earned not less than eight credits at the beginning of the academic year are classified as Third-Year students.

Fourth Year:

Students who have earned not less than thirteen credits at the beginning of the academic year are classified as Fourth-Year students.

Fifth Year:

Students who have earned not less than eighteen credits at the beginning of the academic year are classified as Fifth-Year students.

Partial Students:

Students who meet the matriculation requirements of the University and who are not doing a full year's work but are permitted, subject to the Residence Requirement, to take courses including evening and Summer courses for credit towards a degree are termed Partial Students.
